Rockaway Township works with us to clean the streets and storm drains early in the season to help prevent road gravel from ending up in the lake. 



### LAKE CLOSED

The Lake will be closed to ALL fishing from Wednesday, April 8 at 5:00 pm until April 11 at 8:00 am for Trout stocking.

### **BOATING RULES & REGULATIONS**

#### DUES & FINES must be paid in full to obtain a White Meadow Lake 2020 Boat Tag.

- NJ DMV BOAT REGISTRATION & BOAT SAFETY CERTIFICATE are required for GAS & ELECTRIC powered boats to apply for a boat tag.
- BOAT, TRAILER & MOTOR SIZE- Boat & Trailer Length & Width are required. Maximum boat length-16 ft. Maximum Horse Power- 9.9 HP
- ONLY 2 BOATS PER RACK are allowed.
- OCCUPY DATE- Assigned space(s) must be occupied on June 8, for both dock and land.
- Spaces not occupied on June 8 may be reassigned upon a resident's request for the vacant space. The Office will contact the vacant space holder to advise them reassignment will be done, if after one week the space is not occupied.

- Extenuating circumstances will be considered.
- NO Waiting List will be maintained.
- Residents may SWAP SPACES after notifying the office and obtaining a replacement boat tag for the new space assigned.
- BOAT TAGS must be displayed or POA Security will padlock the boat until the proper tag is visible.
- HANDICAP accessible boat spaces will be available at all locations. A NJ state issued Handicap ID is required.
- CLEAN both your boat and trailer after it has been in another body of water before putting it back into WML.
- REMOVAL DATES- Boats & trailers must be removed before the following dates or the resident will incur a \$100 fine per boat, in addition to a \$10 penalty per boat/per day.
  - Dock Spaces- Monday, October 26, 2020 Land Spaces- Monday, November 16, 2020

#### SEAS BASIC SAILING CLASS Announcing 2020 Sailing Lessons FOR ADULTS AND YOUTH AGES 9 AND UP

In the SEAS Basic Sailing Class, our instructors will take you from landlubber to seafarer through hands-on sailing experience and classroom sessions. In the classroom, you'll learn the fundamental knowledge necessary for getting started on a sailboat, from knots to terms to sailing theory, and then you'll be taken out on the water to apply your new knowledge and develop your sailing skills in a real-life, supervised, nautical setting.

Course includes 4 classroom sessions and 2 water sessions.

June 16, 18, 23, and 25 are classroom sessions and are held at the WML Clubhouse from 7:30 to 9:15 pm.

June 20 and 27 are water sessions hosted at BUDD LAKE on SEAS.

Lessons are taught by instructors from the Society for the Education of the American Sailor (SEAS) Morris club. Included in the course fee is a membership to the SEAS Morris, which becomes active upon completion of the course. Graduates of the course will also receive a certificate for completing the Basic Sailing coursework. Membership to SEAS Morris offers opportunities to practice sailing skills on Budd Lake using the SEAS sailboats.

Sign up and pay by check at the POA Office. Registration ends May 30.

WML Members in good standing \$200. All other students \$225. Registration includes 2019 membership to SEAS Morris.

NOTE – Youth under age 18 must be supervised by an adult at all times. The adult doesn't have to register and pay for the course but if they want to participate in any way (knot tying, water sessions) they need to register and pay. SEAS instructors recommend a person is at least 85 lbs to manage the sunfish sailboats independently, however SEAS instructors are willing to work with any youth ages 9 and up so long as they have the motivation to learn and can actively participate in all classroom and water sessions.

SWIM SKILLS: All participants must be able to swim and tread water over their head without a floatation device. Each person needs to bring their own "PFD" Personal Floatation Device otherwise known as a Life Preserver.

Please note - A supervising (non-paying) parent/guardian will need to be present for all classroom and water sessions for children under 18.


